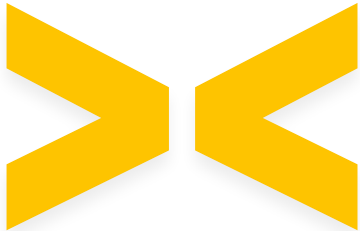
UNITA's Teaching and Learning Center Network offers a series of online professional development workshops designed specifically for educators.

This introductory training course aims to equip early-career university teachers with the fundamental knowledge and practical skills to integrate Generative Artificial Intelligence into their academic practice through the use of Gemini and NotebookLM. Over two interactive sessions of three hours each, participants will explore how these tools can support innovative pedagogical approaches and foster the digital transition in higher education. The course provides hands-on experience in using Gemini for generating and refining educational content, and NotebookLM for analyzing, synthesizing, and organizing academic materials.

This professional development workshop is designed to introduce educators to Generative AI, covering core concepts (LLMs, prompt engineering) and practical tools. The session includes a guided hands-on activity where teachers use AI platforms (like Copilot, Gamma.app, and Brisk Teaching) to create and assess a lesson tailored to their own course topic.

Creating Accessible Digital Course Materials for an Inclusive Learning Environment



Category 3

This 2-hour online session focuses on creating accessible textual documents for diverse learners. Participants will explore the essential principles of making written materials—such as Word documents, PDFs, and slide decks—accessible to all students, including those with visual, cognitive, and motor impairments.

By the end of the session, educators will be equipped to create textual materials that are easy to navigate and accessible for all students, ensuring that their content is inclusive and meets accessibility standards.

Chatbots in Teaching Support: Opportunities, Examples, and Strange Things



Category 2

The workshop will be focused in testing the use of chatbots as a support for teaching activities, in which multiple participants will make activities similar in goals but with some differences in the specific topics, based on differences in expertise. The specific expertise will be a way to validate the results of chatbot interaction, in which the used is a competent supervisor. Additionally, will be presented some incoherencies in the results of the interaction with the chatbot, with all participants having opportunity to share their own experience. Because language is a central issue in international cooperation, will be tested the capabilities of chatbots to work as a multilingual facilitator.

Copyright and Teaching: Principles and Implementation



Category 2

This training provides educators and content creators with a clear understanding of copyright principles and their practical implications in teaching and learning contexts. Participants will explore how copyright applies to educational materials, digital resources, and online content.

The course combines theoretical knowledge with real-life case studies to foster ethical and lawful use of intellectual property in education.

Applied Pedagogy for the Sustainability Transition: Tools and Methods for a Unitary International Perspective



Category 2

This hands-on workshop introduces participants to applied pedagogical strategies for guiding sustainability transitions in higher education. It emphasizes practical tools and methods that can be adapted across diverse international contexts, with a special focus on the UNITA Alliance's vision of a unitary perspective. Participants will engage in collaborative exercises such as systems mapping, stakeholder analysis, and prototype design, while reflecting on how to embed sustainability into curricula/syllabus/courses/seminars and institutional practices.

The training balances theory and practice, ensuring that participants leave with actionable frameworks and co-created outputs.
